To the Hon. County Court of Wasilla County
This is to certify that we Jas. H. Raley
Co. Surveyor, J. R. Gerking, Solomon J. Hornley, Moses Woodward
viewers with James Depuy and Barton Depuy chairmen and
S. H. Derrick Assessor, met qualified and entered upon our
duties on the 19th day of Sept. 1878. In the matter of change in W. H.
and Hill Road, Beginning at the S. E. corner of the S. 1/4 of Sec 1
T4 N. R. 34 E Set a post marked "R" for beginning, Run N 40°
10' to Sec post, Set "A" post and run North 2 1/2 miles noting
gulches and marking each successive mile by its appropriate and
legal post as shown in accompanying plat at termination
of miles three ("M III") set "A" post and run N. 40° Set "A" post
and run N. 40° at 37.10 Set "M IV" post, at 40 set "A" and run
E 40° to Sec post named in petition, The last 8.10 being im-
practicable as shown in plat, was retraced and "A" post set
at 31.70. Thence run N 25° E, 11° 10' and set "A" post run N 56°
19' and set "M V" continued 11.10 intersecting W. H. and Hill
road on top of hill, viewers reported said road the best practicable
route to crossing of Pine creek and ordered post marked "R"
set at 11.10 from "miles V" which was done and said survey
declared completed on the 19 of Sept 1878

Believing the route surveyed is a practicable and much
needed one, we recommend its adoption.
