

Field Notes of Change in Road No 124

Penalton Oregon, May 16th, 1898

I commenced at a point on the old road survey No 124, 13.12 chains East of the center of Sec 4 in T 5 N R 32 E W M., set post 4x4x48 inches, 30 feet west of initial point marked R. C. No 124, dug pits and raised mound of earth around post 4 feet wide at base and 18 inches high.

In the matter of Viewing, Surveying and laying out County Road No 497

To the Honorable County Court of the State of Oregon, for Umatilla County:

We, the undersigned, the Viewers heretofore appointed to view and locate Road No 497 submit the following report: Pursuant to an order of the Honorable Court we met John W Kimbrell, Surveyor, at Adams, on Aug. 25th, 1898, and were by him, each duly sworn to faithfully and impartially discharge the duties of our appointments:

We called to our aid Leary Kimbrell, U S M<sup>c</sup>Donald, Chairman, and J W Kimbrell, marker, who were by the Surveyor each duly sworn. We viewed, surveyed and located said Road No 497 as specified in our order, and find the route practicable, and would most respectfully recommend the same to be established as a public highway of Umatilla County, Oregon.

That W<sup>m</sup> Baker, R Morrison and J W Kirby met at the post office in the town of Adams, as per order of Court, to each of whom I administered the usual oath; J W Kirby not being well enough to stand the trip I proceeded to survey and locate the road with the other two viewers.
