

PLAT AND RECORD OF SURVEY No. 1

Request of M Cantwell

Township 4 North Range 35 East -
August 29. 1878

Having been requested by M. Cantwell to locate Cor for Secs 29, 30, 31, + 32 of the above T. I secured the services of C. S. Briggs and A. J. Crofut as chainmen and after qualifying these gentlemen according to law I proceeded to run the following random lines guided by Field Notes of the Original Government Survey. Beginning at the 1/4 Sec Post bet. 29 and 32. - I ran **Var. 20° East**

West x x x 50 00
South E. 84 00 101 94

Found no traces of Cor. Cor. on this line I went to Cor for Secs 30 + 31 of said Township. Said Cor. being in good preservation as described by Field notes. Thence I ran To former starting point - No traces of intervening Cor.

Thursday Sept. 3rd 1878

Resumed the survey. New Higdon + M Cantwell duly qualified to act as chain bearers. Beginning at 1/4 S post between Secs 29 + 30 I ran - **Var. 20° East.**

Found Sec. Cor. for 31 + 32 as described in notes **Var 20° 30' E.** I ran thence Pine Creek - Course West. Pine Grove - along East side of ridge. Set temp 1/2" round Basalt rock x x 10 x 15" + large nail Along west side of Canyon to point 3 links west of large boulder rock in head of Canyon Course South. Set temp Cor for Secs 29, 30, 31 + 32.

 N. E. 9 30 37 50 To center of line 29. Thence $\frac{1}{4}$ Cor on
 west bdy of Sec 29 and run down through
 center of said Sec.
 S. E. 88 30 30 00 thence 40 links South of $\frac{1}{4}$ Cor on E bdy
 Sec 29. Correction is 10 links to 20 chains.
 Proceeded to set 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ Cor of 4 E $\frac{1}{4}$ of SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of

 ing to the divisions above made.

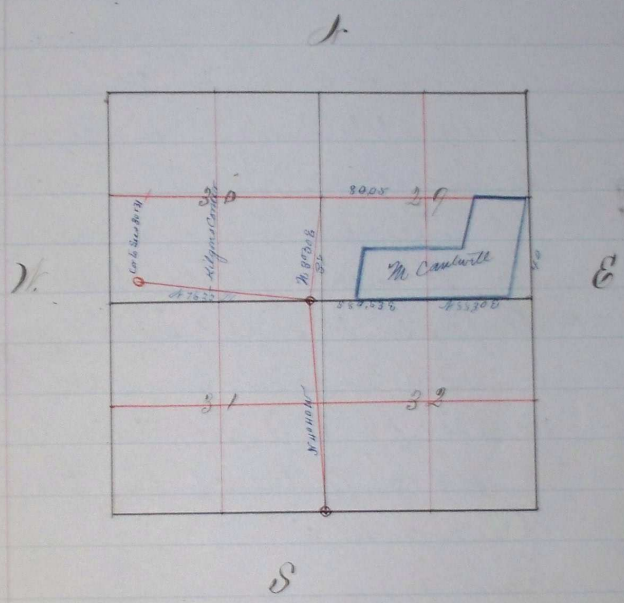
