				which is the original charred stake in mound, in field, on west side of spur, dropping south, and 300 links E. of a ravine, course South.
				Set over the charred end of original $\frac{1}{4}$ S. post, a porous basalt stone, 15 x 13 x 8 ins. mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ on west face. - Thence, run, on a random line, between secs. 17 & 18. - $\gamma$ a $21^\circ$ East.

				I mark the sections, properly upon a few post of legal dimensions, and set same at true cor. point. I deposit two sd. nails, two 10 d. nails, $\frac{1}{4}$ no 14 screw, one wire staple and small twisted knot fencing wire.

∴ I move temp. cor. to secs. 17, 18, 19 & 20, South 97 links, then west  $115\frac{3}{5}$  lks and set a basalt stone 25 x 10 x 6 ins. mkd. 5 notches on E. and 3 notches on S. in flat on S. side Middle Cold Springs C.

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Move temp  $\frac{1}{4}$  S. cor. bet sees 19 & 20, South, 194 links, then west 231 $\frac{3}{4}$  links, and a basalt stone 15x8x6 ins. mhd.  $\frac{1}{4}$  on west, on gentle N. slope.

Move temp. cor. to sees. 19, 20, 29 & 30, South 291 links, then west 300 links, and set a basalt stone 18x7x4 ins. mhd. 5 notches on E, and 2 notches on S corner, in slight swag, on gentle S. slope. (Harry Gibson sworn in as flagman)

From this last described corner, run on a random line between sees 20 & 29, or 21 & 8

  - 79 71 Int. N. & S. line 19 $\frac{1}{2}$  links S. of cor. to sees 20, 21, 28 & 29. (swearing in)
- Move temp  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. west 14 $\frac{1}{2}$  links, then North 9 $\frac{3}{4}$  links, and a porous basalt stone 10x9x7 ins. mhd.  $\frac{1}{4}$  on N. on N.E. slopes of hill. By request, set stone 22 ins. deep, and over it set cedar post mhd  $\frac{1}{4}$

From cor. to sees. 18, 19, 13 & 24, on line bet ranges 31 & 32 E. and T4 N., which is a mound containing bits of the decayed original sec. post, with indications of mks. & charcoal. This cor. it is claimed by E. Himelbaugh, George Gibson & son Harry is the identical and unquestioned original Gov. cor. - I suspect, in the mound the most want bits of original sec. post, charcoal, and 2 plow irons, containing 8 holes. This cor. is under a wire fence bearing E. & W. on N. hill side, 150 links (about) south of a ravine, course ENE.

- 40 00 Set temp  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. - Find no indications of orig. cor. - made Cold Spring
- 44 00 Base of hill, precipitous, stony ascent from M. C. S. cañon.
- 50 26 Ravine, course S.W.
- 60 80 " " S.
- 81 30 Int. E. & W. line 11 $\frac{1}{2}$  lks west of cor to sees 12, 13, 7 & 18, which is the original mound with pits, the original post lying on the mound 150 links S. of a ravine, course S.W. and on gentle N.W. slope.
