

PLAT AND RECORD OF SURVEY No. 13719

Request of Chas. A. Butler, Dec. 14th 1892

Survey Commrs. H. M. Kitner and Sam. D. Endicott. Instrument a mason
 True dolite. At true point for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. bet. sec. 7th & 8th T37N. R. 36E, as verified
 by T. F. McCabe, J. N. Davidson, Chas. A. Butler and R. F. Johnson, at which
 point I find old decayed end of pine post, 15 ins. in ground, set over end of
 old post, a basalt stone 20x8x8 ins. 18 ins. in ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ on W. face.

I find $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. bet. sec. 8th & 9th in said T³⁷N. R. 36E, which is a willow post 3 ins.
 dia. flattened on W. face, mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S. on same side 32 ft above ground, from which a
 tamarack 8 ins. dia. tr. s. & course 7 ft. dist. A tamarack, 10 ins. dia. tr. s. nearly west
 29 ft. dist. (I am not in possession of the original notes of the survey of this T³⁷N.)
 Snow covers the ground from 8 to 10 ins. deep.

I find a point on true Eth & W. center line through sec. 8, whence
 I can see flags at $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. on Eth on W. bdy. of said section, from which
 point, center of door in E. end of a school house bears S. of line 18° 43'; I set line
 of stakes marking line west of point.

I find the original post to $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. bet. sec. 8th & 17, which is
 a pine, 4 ins. dia. properly faced and marked on bench on W. hill side, lying
 in the snow. post mkd. Q. U. R. M. C. - 517 - 58. I find the bearing trees to
 M. C. both cut down. I measure from the point where the said $\frac{1}{4}$ S. post lay
 in the snow - west - va. 20° 30' E.

94 To M. C. post, a few feet of wild Horse Creek; from this line, west
 a few ins. dia. mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S. B. bears (from starting point) R. 11° 33', 36 ft. dist.
 a pine 10 L. 9° 36', 46'
 These two are 18 $\frac{1}{2}$ ft. apart. on request, I connect the point described, with the $\frac{1}{4}$
 S. cor. on N. bdy. of sec. 8, and at intersection of true E and W. line, I set a ba-
 salt stone 19x12x7 ins. mkd. C. S. on N. face, and + on top, 18 ins. in ground, to mark
 probable center Sec. 8. and to hold point on true Eth & W. line, stating to parties
 concerned, that I do not know how this cor. may be varied west, and that I
 will obtain original notes and correct the same, the first call I have in
 this locality.
