COUNTY SURVEYOR

I, F. B. Hayes, do depose and say that I am the duly appointed and authorized and elected County Surveyor of Umatilla County, Oregon.


I have examined the road described in the attached copy of the resolution, the description of which is as follows:

A 30 foot right-of-way, being 15 feet on each side of the center line over and across a portion of Sections 1 and 2, Township 2, North Range 27, EWM., being particularly described as follows: Beginning at a point which is 2702.6 feet South of and 1187.5 feet West of the NE corner of Sec. 1, Twp. 2, North Range 27, EWM., the said point being adjacent to and on the West edge of the pavement of State Secondary Highway No. 320, thence North 86 degrees, 23 minutes West 346.2 feet; thence South 87 degrees, 39 minutes West 2706.1 feet; thence North 82 degrees, 34 minutes West 344.9 feet; thence South 87 degrees, 11 minutes West 1060.1 feet; thence North 74 degrees, 38 minutes West 39.9 feet; thence North 59 degrees, 30 minutes West 387.8 feet; thence North 72 degrees, 54 minutes West 765 feet to the center of road No. 116, the last defined point being located 2354 feet South of and 6840.6 feet West of the point of beginning of this survey,

The above being the actual survey of the land described in the general description as set forth in the deed from Katherine Stanfield to Umatilla County, recorded in Book 142, Page 399 of the Deed Records of Umatilla County, Oregon.

It is my opinion that the road should be vacated for the following reasons: that the road is useless as a part of the county road system, is burdensome to maintain, and the public will be benefitted by its vacation.
