

Found a 2" iron pipe with 2 1/2" brass cap, marked as shown, at the Northern toe of a rock berm for a pond.

From the iron pipe position, I take new accessories:

#### NEW BEARING TREES:


A 5" Douglas Fir bears South 27° East, a distance of 16.00 feet, marked W 1/16 S16 BT. A 10" double boled White Fir bears North 3.15 feet, marked W 1/16 S9 BT.

I used a steel tape and magnetic compass in the establishment of the bearing trees. Magnetic declination used was 13° East. Bearings are to a brass washer marked OPLS 83571 in the lower blaze of the tree. Distance is to a spike set in the root crown of the side of the tree.
