CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

HISTORY OF ORIGINAL CORNER ESTABLISHED:

Corner originally established by Currin and Noland under GLO Contract dated May 4, 1887. Surveyor General field notes state:

Set Basalt Stone 12x12x6 ins., 8 ins. in the ground for 1/4 Sec. cor. marked 1/4 on N face, from which: A fir, 8 ins. diam. bears N40°E, 37 lks. dist. marked 1/4 S BT. A fir, 8 ins. diam. bears S45°E, 23 lks. dist. marked 1/4 S BT.

Corner recovered in GLO resurvey of the Diminished Umatilla Indian Reservation, executed by L.E. Wilkes under special instructions dated February 20, 1917. Survey General field notes state:

At a point 2 lks. W of cor. Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground for witness cor to the 1/4 sec. cor., with brass cap, from which: A fir, 10 ins. diam. bears N50°E, 34 lks. dist., marked 1/4 SDRBT (Old B.T.) A fir, 10 ins. diam. bears S36°E, 25 lks. dist., blazes healed over, not opened. This tree has fallen down. A fir, 9 ins. diam., bears N45°30'W, 56 lks. dist. marked 1/4 S9 DR BT.(New B.T.)

DESCRIPTION OF CORNER EVIDENCE FOUND: Found a 2 1/2" iron pipe with 2 1/2" brass cap, marked as shown below, protruding 8" above ground.


DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES I ESTABLISHED TO PERPETUATE THE ORIGINAL LOCATION OF THIS CORNER: From the iron pipe monument,

NEW BEARING TREES: A 3" White Fir bears North 75° East, a distance of 15.20 feet, marked X BT. A 6" White Fir bears South 28° West, a distance of 10.10 feet, marked 1/4 S16 BT. A 6" White Fir bears North 9° West, a distance of 14.30 feet, marked 1/4 S9 BT. No non-merchantable trees in NW quadrant. Area is anticipated to be logged. A steel fencepost bears East approx. 2 ft.

I hereby certify that the corner was perpetuated April 12, 2017.

I used a steel tape and magnetic compass in the establishment of the bearing trees. Magnetic declination used was 13° East. Bearings are to a brass washer marked OPLS 83571 in the lower blaze of the tree. Distance is to a spike set in the root crown of the side of the tree.
