No original corner evidence found. From a proportionate position, a ponderosa pine tree bears Northerly, approx 119 feet with BIA k-tag (marks illegible) and Valsetz Lumber tag marks '1.17 chs. S'. No other evidence found.

DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES I ESTABLISHED

TO PERPETUATE THE ORIGINAL LOCATION OF THIS CORNER:

At proportionate position, I set a 2 1/2" x 30" Aluminum Pipe, 10" in the ground, to bedrock, with a 2 2" Aluminum cap marked as shown below, in a collar of stone 1 1/2 ft. diam., from which:

A $5/8" \times 15"$ rebar bears North 42°53' East, a distance of 16.01 feet, marked BGB SURVEY MARKER NE RP.

A 5/8" x 15" rebar bears South 66°35' East, a distance of 14.52 feet, marked BGB SURVEY MARKER SE RP.


