

CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

T 2N, R 32E., W.M.

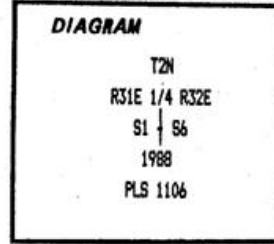
Corner Code No. C-1

History of original corner establishment:

This corner was originally established by J. Burnett, U.S. Deputy Surveyor, under Contract No. 72, dated September 12, 1860. The original notes state that at the corner a wood post was set with charred stake, earth mounds and pits.

In 1904, this corner was declared lost and was reestablished by John Kimbrell in County Survey No. 212. The notes of Survey No. 212 state that at the reestablished corner point a 18" by 6" by 5" stone was set in a mound of stones.

Description of corner evidence found:

None. This corner was reestablished by single proportion measure between the reestablished S 1/16 corner common to Sections 7 and 12 and the reestablished N.W. corner of Section 6, using John Kimbrell's record distances from County Survey Nos. 147 and 212.

The reestablished corner point falls at a fence corner with the fences going east and north. There are a few scattered stones around the corner but none could be identified as the Kimbrell corner stone.

Description of monument and accessories established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

At the reestablished corner point, set a 2 1/2" brass cap on a 1 1/2" by 30" galv. iron pipe, 24" in the ground and surrounded with a mound of earth and stone. Set two reference monuments referencing the reestablished corner monument. From the reestablished corner monument:

A 1 1/2" yellow plastic cap marked "W.R. Wells, PLS 1106", set on a 5/8" by 30" iron rod bears N1°E 12.10'.

A 1 1/2" aluminum cap marked as shown, set on a 5/8" by 30" iron rod bears S80°E 18.21'.

Both reference monuments are set near the fence lines.

Set steel fence posts near each reference monument and attached witness corner and bearing object signs. Placed witness corner sign on the wood fence post next to the new corner monument.

The aluminum cap on the reference monument is marked as follows:
