

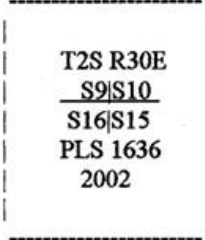
CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

J - 13
DIAGRAM

History of original corner establishment:

The original corner was established by George S. Pershin on September 6, 1878, under GLO contract No. 293, as follows:

Set a stone, 15" x 9" x 7", for corner to sections 9, 10, 15 and 16. Dug pits and drove a alder stake as per instructions.



Original corner evidence recovered:

Found the original corner stone solidly set 6" in the ground on the east edge of a mound of stones. The corner stone is 15" x 7" x 6" and is plainly marked with three notches on the east edge and two notches on the north edge. The stake and pits of record are gone.

Monument and accessories established to perpetuate the original position of this corner:

In place of the original corner stone, I set a 1" x 18" flared, galvanized iron pipe 9" into the ground to bed rock. A 2 1/2" brass cap attached to the top of the iron pipe is marked as shown in the diagram above. I bury the corner stone along the north side of the pipe and build a mound of stones around the pipe, from which:

- A 5/8" x 24" iron rod set 23" into the ground with a 3/4" brass washer, marked "PLS 1636 10", attached at ground level, bears N58° E, 128.6 feet.
- A 5/8" x 24" iron rod set 23" into the ground with a 3/4" brass washer, marked "PLS 1636 15", attached at ground level, bears S32° E, 161.3 feet.
- A 5/8" x 24" iron rod set 23" into the ground with a 3/4" brass washer, marked "PLS 1636 16", attached at ground level, bears S51° W, 122.2 feet.
- A 5/8" x 24" iron rod set 23" into the ground with a 3/4" brass washer, marked "PLS 1636 S9", attached at ground level, bears N43° W, 174.9 feet.

I hereby certify the above corner point was perpetuated as hereon described on July 31, 2002. Magnetic declination set in compass: 19° 30' E.
