A fir, 10 ins. in dia. bears $N 30^{\circ} \mathrm{E}, 30 \mathrm{lks}$. dist. marked T2S R35E S17 BT.
A fir, 6 ins. in dia. bears $N 38^{\circ} \mathrm{W}, 12$ lks. dist., marked T2S R35E S18 BT.
A fir 10 ins. in dia. bears $S 47^{\circ} \mathrm{W}, 36 \mathrm{lks}$. dist. marked T2S R35E S19 BT.
A fir 8 ins. in dia. bears $S 35^{\circ} \mathrm{E}, 6$ lks. dist. marked T 2 S R35E S20 BT.

Corner recovered and replaced by L.E. Wilkes under GLO special instructions dated February 20, 1917, included under Group No. 29. Field Notes state:
The cor. of secs. 17, 18, 19 and 20 , which is an old post, 4 ins. sq., firmly set, marked and witnessed as decribed by the surveyor general, except that all bearing trees are now dead. I perpetuate this cor., as follows: at the exact cor. point.
Set a volcanic stone, $20 \times 16 \times 6$ ins., 15 ins. in the ground, for cor. of secs. 17, 18, 19 and 20, marked with 3 notches on $S$. and 5 notces on $E$. edge, from which:
A tamarack, 20 ins. diam., bears N. $45^{\circ} 45^{\prime}$ E., 97 lks. dist., marked T2S R35E SI7 BT.
A balsam, 7 ins. diam., bears S. $67^{\circ} \mathrm{E} ., 54$ lks. dist., marked T2S R35E S20 BT.
A balsam, 7 ins. diam., bears $S .12^{\circ} \mathrm{W} ., 62 \mathrm{lks}$. dist., marked T2S R35E S19 BT.
A pine, 30 ins. diam., bears $N .47^{\circ} 30^{\circ} \mathrm{W} ., 28 \mathrm{lks}$. dist., marked T2S R35E S18 BT.
In 1968, Ralph Thompson recovers and replaced the volcanic stone. Umatilla County Monumentation records state:
Found Original stone, $20 x 16 x 6,15$ ins. in the ground, marked with $3 n o t c h e s$ on $S$. and 5 notches on E. edge.
At the exac= corner, I set a $1 \times 36$ inch galvanized pipe with a 2 泛" brass cap securely fastened to the top. I buried the original stone alongside of the pipe and raised a mound of earth and stones around it. from which bears the new bearing trees.

Found $23 / 2$ brass cap marked as shown below, flush with the ground in a collar of stone, from which:
A 13" fir stump bears North $20^{\circ}$ East, a distance of 31.1 ft. scribe marks visible.
A 20 " fir stump bears South $26^{\circ}$ East, a distance of 37.75 feet scribe marks visible. A $9^{\prime \prime}$ fir stump bears South $62^{\circ}$ West, a distance of 29.1 feet, with dead and downed log alongside with scribe marks visible.

An $8^{\prime \prime}$ Douglas Fir bears South $4^{\circ}$ West, a distance of 21.35 feet, marked T2S R35E S19 BT. A $7^{\prime \prime}$ Ponderosa Pine bears North $84^{\circ}$ West, a distance of 34.30 feet, marked T2S R35E S18 BT.
