4. Description of Corners: Set stone $18 \times 10 \times 8$ on Reeky point facing S. E. for corners to section 27,28,33, \& 34 , fromwhich: Fir 20 inches diameter bears $\mathrm{S} 12^{6} \mathrm{E} 107$ links distant. Fir 12 inches diameter bears $\mathrm{S} 48^{\circ} \mathrm{W} 96$ links distant. No trees on North side.
5. Investigation Notes: Using USGS notes and aerial photos as guide, we traveled south up Ryan Creek to search area indicated by photo. Found doad 6" cottonwood with K. tag stating the sec. corner was west approx. $4 \frac{1}{2}$ chains. Found $22 "$ fir B.T. markings were T.3.N. R. 36 E Sec. 33 at botton the scribbing looked like: $\mathrm{S} 48^{\circ}$. W. The $S, 4$, \& $W$ was destroyed or not out out. OOther B.T. missing, but there is an old stump believed to be the B.T. We went N $48^{\circ}$ E 96 links from $22^{\prime \prime}$ fir B.T. We found a rock that may be the sec. corner. We sprayed silver paint on rock, placed B.T. sign on $22^{\prime \prime}$ fir. Sub. pt. $12^{\prime \prime}$ P.P. on S.E. exposure in opening with orange ribbon and silver paint on bears $S 18^{\circ} \mathrm{W} 110$ links dist. to stone from $16^{\prime \prime}$ P.P. known B.T. Fir at this point is a dead Fir snag, with good blaze.
Best way in is up Ryan Creek just before making one of the creek crossing, there is a $16^{\prime \prime}$ Fir on right side of trail with silver paint and orange ribbon, then go west approximately $41 / 2$ chains.
