Each BT has a sign 54-3 attached 61.below a band of red paint and has a brass washer marked RFE 2808 nailed flush with BT blaze.


When this corner was set in 1878 by George S. Pershin it was called the corner to sections $1,12,6$ \& 7 but in 1899 when John W. Kimbrell surveyed T 3 NR 38 E he found the corner to sections 6 \& 7 to be 9.65 chains north of Pershin's location. Kimbrell consequently set his corner to sections 6 \& 7 and destroyed the references to said sections on Pershin's section corner. Therefore, the two pine BT's are believed to be Pershin's original bearing trees.
