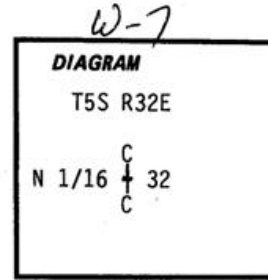


CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

History of original corner establishment:

Corner position determined by Bureau of Land Management during survey performed between 1968-1980, Set an iron post 28 ins. long, 2 1/2 ins. diam., 14 ins in the ground to solid rock, in a mound of stone, 2 1/2 ft. base to top, with brass cap attached, marked:

N 1/16 | S32

No suitable trees available within limits.

Description of corner evidence found:

Found a 2 1/2" dia. iron pipe, firmly set in a mound of stone, with brass cap marked as described in the BLM record.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

We mark new bearing trees as follows:

- An 8" Ponderosa Pine, scribed "CN 1/16 S 32 BT" on a double blaze, bears N 4°E 190.3 ft.
- And a 12" Ponderosa Pine, scribed "CN 1/16 S 32 BT" on a double blaze bears S 70°E 289.6 ft.
- Attached brass washer marked "LS 1099" to lower blaze of new BT's.

Corner is located 18 ft. south of an E-W fence.
