I commenced at N.E. cor. Sec. 1 T4N1635E, R. 35.

Thence I run west on blank line on first standard parallel north

40 00 set ten. 14 Sec. Cor.

71 32 a point 212 lks. N of corner of fence running east and west and north.

There were also some rock at the fence corner evidently put there to perpetuate corner.

From thence I continue on same line

80 00 set ten. Sec. Cor.

40 00 set ten. 14 Sec. Cor.

91 27 a point 45 lks. south of rock evidently set for 1/6 Sec. Cor. on the South side of S.E. 1/4 of Sec. 35

As my survey is principally for the purpose of determining the S.W. corner of Sec. 36 T. 5 N. and the N.W. cor. of Sec. 1 T. 4 N. R. 35, we return to the S.W. cor. of Sec. 36 above mentioned and call Cor. J. J. Morrison, said to be an old settler who would probably know more about the corner in question than any one else available

Being duly sworn he said:

I helped put up the first fence running from the S.W. corner of Sec. 36 T. 5 N. R. 35 to the N.W. cor. He put up a fence running N.

and E. from the corner. The old stake was standing when we put up the fence and we run the fence to the north and stake both from the E. and from the N. The first fence was built in 1874 or 1875. A number of fences have been built since then and I don't know whether they were put where the old fence was or not, but never heard of the location of the fence line running E. and W. being changed at the point where the corner stood.

Mr. Sams thought the corner had been moved South but did not know anything about it having been moved and had never heard anything to that effect. His opinion was based, as he stated, on the fact that the corner was not in line with the corners E. and W. from the corner in question. I refer to the field notes of T. A. N. R. 35 E. and find that the length of the section line on the E. of Sec 1 is given as 67.25 chs. between Secs. 1 and 2 63.10 ^{chs.} between Secs. 2 and 3, 64.35 ^{chs.} between the corner in question over 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ chs. out of line (continued on page 546)
