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

Scope of Work for Cultural Resources Inventory for the Umatilla River Trail Phase 1 Project, Umatilla County, Oregon

Substrate Collaborative Anthropological Research (Substrate) offers this brief scope of work to complete the cultural resources task to support Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA) compliance for the above-mentioned project. Substrate anticipates the following tasks to complete the field survey and report.

Task 1: Project Management and Administration: Substrate will coordinate directly with Umatilla County, ODOT, and the CTUIR to initiate the project. The project manager will oversee quality control, day-to-day scheduling, cost control, and attend all necessary meetings throughout the project. An archaeologist meeting the Secretary of Interior standards and is a "Qualified Archaeologist" in the State of Oregon (ORS 390.325) will supervise all work completed for the cultural resource inventory.

Task 2: Prefield Literature Review and Permitting: As the project is within public right-of-way managed by Umatilla County, Substrate will obtain a State of Oregon Archaeological Excavation permit from the Oregon State Historic Preservation Office. Concurrently, we will conduct a records search and literature review, including a review of historical maps for a one-mile radius around the Project Area. We will use the Oregon Archaeological Records Remote Access (OARRA) to identify existing cultural resources and review previously completed cultural resource inventories. We will supplement those data with any documentation the CTUIR or other entity provides. The location of existing cultural resources will be imported onto paper field maps and digital mapping software prior to fieldwork.

Task 3: Fieldwork: All fieldwork completed for this project will follow the Guidelines for Conducting Field Archaeology in Oregon (Oregon SHPO 2016a). Substrate estimates up to three days of in-field survey and resource documentation. The field survey will include pedestrian survey of the entire approximately 4.5-mile Project Area and subsurface investigations (up to 60 shovel probes [SPs] at areas determined to be sensitive for cultural resources. Transect spacing will not exceed 20 meters. Areas more likely to contain cultural resources will be investigated more intensely with more closely spaced transects. A sampling strategy may be developed for SPs depending on landforms, sediments, and ground visibility. Artifacts recovered from SPs will be collected and curated in a manner consistent with the Guidelines for the Preparation of Archaeological Collections (University of Oregon Museum of Natural and Cultural History 2022) No artifacts will be collected from the surface.

Task 4: Resource Documentation and Forms: Substrate anticipates preparing up to one new archaeological site form and up to two archaeological isolate forms to document new cultural resources. In addition, Substrate anticipates preparing two archaeological site forms to update a previously recorded site within the Project Area and an adjacent previously recorded site. Site and isolate forms will be entered online into the Archaeological Sites Database managed by the Oregon SHPO. Following review and approval of each draft form by ODOT, new forms will be submitted once any necessary changes have been made.

Task 5: Technical Reporting: Substrate will produce a report that will satisfy all documentation standards outlined in the State of Oregon Guidelines for Reporting on Archaeological Investigations (Oregon SHPO 2016b). The report will summarize all the tasks described above and include a regional environmental and cultural background, a summary of the records search and literature review results, a review of the research design and applied field methods, findings from the inventory and associated maps and photographs, and management recommendations and conclusions summarizing project findings. Following review and approval by the ODOT, the final report, GIS spatial data, and other pertinent documentation will be submitted by ODOT to the Oregon SHPO and Tribes unless otherwise specified.
