INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS

1.0 <u>SUBMITTAL OF PROPOSAL</u>

All bids must be presented in a sealed envelope to the Umatilla County Board of Commissioners before 10:00 A.M., December 16, 2022. Bids submitted electronically or by fax will are <u>not acceptable</u>.

1.1 COMPLETE PROPOSAL MUST BE RETURNED. Bidders shall use the attached bid form. Bidder shall complete unit price, extended price and lead time for each valve component, along with the bid subtotal, freight total and total bid amount, and the amount of days the bid will be valid. The firm name and signature of an authorized person shall be in space provided.

3.0 <u>DELIVERY</u>

1.0 DATE

2.0 PARTIES and NOTICES

2.1 The parties to this agreement are UMATILLA COUNTY, a political subdivision of the State of Oregon, 216 SE 4th Street, Pendleton, Oregon, 97801 ("County"), and

- 2.3 Any notices under this contract shall be in writing and shall be effective when actually delivered or when deposited in the mail, registered or certified, addressed to the parties at the address set forth in paragraph 2.1, or such other address as either party may designate by written notice to the other.
 - 2.3 The Federal Tax Identification Number for Contractor is

3.0 VALVES

3.1 Contractor agrees to provide the following valves and related equipment, on the terms and the conditions of this agreement.

(LIST OF ITEMS)

- 3.2 Contractor agrees to sell the equipment on the terms and the conditions of this agreement and as set out in its Bid Form and the Invitation to Bid.
- 3.3 Project includes any state permits and inspections. Services to be in accordance with any requirements of the State of Oregon.

4.0 DELIVERY

- 4.1 The valves will be delivered as soon possible, on the following schedule:
- 4.2 Contractor will not be held responsible for delay or default caused by fire, riot, acts of God and war that is beyond Contractor's reasonable control. Contractor will, however, make all

reasonable efforts to remove or eliminate such a cause of delay or default, and will, upon cessation of the cause, diligently pursue performance of its obligations under the contract.

- 4.3 The equipment will be delivered to Hermiston, Oregon, area. A more specific location in the area will be provided at a later date.
- 4.4 The equipment will be consolidated as much as possible for delivery, to minimize the amount of deliveries.

5.0 PRICE

- 5.1 The price paid to Contractor for the equipment, including required permits shall be \$
- 5.2 Payment will be made to Contractor from the County on a monthly basis within 30 days after receipt of a proper invoice by the appropriate authority. Unless otherwise instructed in writing, the County shall send payment to Contractor at the address in paragraph 2.1.

6.0 RESPONSIBILITIES OF CONTRACTOR

- 6.1 Contractor shall sell, provide and deliver the valves and related equipment listed in paragraph 3.0.
- 6.2 Contractor shall deliver the equipment in the time set out in its bid. Time is of the essence.
- 6.3 Contractor shall submit all manufacturer's cut sheets electronically for technical approval to ordnanceproject@umatillacounty.gov within 2 weeks of the date of this agreement.
- 6.4 Contractor shall submit all applicable manufacturer's operation and maintenance manuals electronically to <u>ordnanceproject@umatillacounty.gov</u> within 6 weeks of the date of this agreement.

7.0 APPLICATION OF LAW

- 7.1 Each party shall comply with all federal, state, and local laws and ordinances applicable to the work under this contract.
- 7.2 The provisions of this contract shall be construed and enforced in accordance with the provisions of the law of the State of Oregon. Venue for any action or suit concerning the interpretation or enforcement of this contract must be brought in Circuit Court in Umatilla County, Oregon

8.0 SUPPLEMENTAL TERMS

Attached to this document and incorporated by this reference is Exhibit 1, which include supplemental terms for a public improvement contract.

9.0 INSURANCE

- 9.1 Contractor shall provide and maintain at its own expense during the term of this contract such insurance as is specified in this contract. Certificates for each and every form of insurance required shall be furnished to the County upon request.
- 9.2 Contractor shall provide General Liability Insurance in an amount not less than \$1,000,000.00 per occurrence. Such General Liability Insurance shall provide coverage for bodily injury, including personal injury, and property damage insurance, including automobile, as will protect Contractor and the County and its officers and employees from all things or damage which may arise from operations performed under this Contract or in connection therewith. The insurance shall be written on a comprehensive form which includes broad form property damage on an occurrence basis. If requested, complete policy copies shall be provided to the County. Failure to maintain liability insurance as provided above shall, at the County's option, be cause for immediate termination of the Contract.

10.0 INDEMNIFICATION

- 10.1 Contractor agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the County and its board, officers, agents, and employees, from any and all claims, suits, or actions of whatsoever nature resulting from or arising out of the activities of Contractor, its agents or employees, under this agreement.
- 10.2 Contractor is not an officer, employee, or agent of Umatilla County as those terms are defined in ORS 30.265.

11.0 TERMINATION FOR CAUSE

- 11.1 If either party fails to perform any obligations imposed by this contract and does not correct or commence and make reasonable corrections of such failure within 15 days after receipt of written notice from the non-defaulting party specifying the manner in which the other party is in default, the non-defaulting party may terminate this contract, or take any action allowed by law, including specific performance.
- 11.2 The rights and remedies of the parties provided in this contract shall not be exclusive and are in addition to any other rights and remedies provided by law.

- 11.3 The failure of a party to enforce any provision of this contract shall not constitute a waiver by that party of that or any other provision.
- 11.4 In the event suit or action is instituted to enforce any of the terms of this contract, each party shall pay its own costs, including attorney fees.

12.0 SUCCESSOR INTERESTS

This contract shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties, their successors and assigns.

13.0 MODIFICATION and INCORPORATION

- 13.1 This contract, the Invitation to Bid, and Bid Form constitute the entire agreement between the parties.
- 13.2 No modification, or change of terms of this contract shall bind either party unless in writing and signed by both parties.
- 13.3 The representations contained in the proposal of Contractor shall survive the execution of this agreement and shall be binding on Contractor as any other condition and provision of this contract.
- 13.4 Contractor, by signature of its authorized representative, hereby acknowledges that it has read this contract, understands it, and agrees to be bound by its terms and conditions.

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EXHIBIT 1 SUPPLEMENTARY TERMS

The contract shall be governed by the additional terms and conditions set forth herein:

- 1. The Contractor (Contractor) shall make payment promptly, as due, to all persons supplying to such contractor labor or materials for the prosecution of the work provided in this contract.
- 2. All employers, including Contractor, that employ subject workers who work under this contract in the State of Oregon shall comply with ORS 656.017 and provide the required Workers' Compensation coverage, unless such employers are exempt under ORS 656.126. Contractor shall ensure that each of its subcontractors complies with these requirements. Contractor shall pay all contributions or amounts due for Workers' Compensation coverage from the Contractor incurred in the performance of the contract.
- 3. The Contractor will not permit any lien or claim to be filed or prosecuted against the County on account of any material or labor furnished to the Contractor.
- 4. The Contractor will pay to the Oregon Department of Revenue all sums withheld from employees pursuant to Oregon Statutes.
- 5. Contractor represents that an employee drug testing program is in place for Contractor's employees.
- 6. If the Contractor fails, neglects, or refuses to make prompt payment of any claim for labor or services furnished to the Contractor or a subcontractor by any person in connection with this contract as such claim shall become due, the proper officer or officers representing the County may pay such claim to the person furnishing the labor or service and charge the amount of the payment against funds due or to become due to the Contractor by reason of this contract. The payment of a claim in this manner authorized by this paragraph shall not relieve the Contractor or the Contractor's surety from obligation with respect to any unpaid claim.
- 7. If the Contractor or its subcontractor fails, neglects or refuses to make payment to a person furnishing labor or materials within 30 days after receipt of payment from the County or Contractor, the Contractor or subcontractor shall owe the person the amount due plus interest charges commencing at the end of the 10-day period that payment is due under ORS 279C.580(4) and ending upon final payment, unless payment is subject to a good faith dispute as defined in ORS 279C.580. The rate of interest charged to the Contractor or subcontract on the amount due shall equal three times the discount rate on 90-day commercial paper in effect at the Federal Reserve Bank in the Federal Reserve district that includes Oregon on the date that is 30 days after the date when payment was received from the County or Contract, but the rate of interest shall not exceed 30 percent.

- 8. If the Contractor or its subcontractor fails, neglects or refuses to make payment to a person furnishing labor or materials in connection with this contract, the person may file a complaint with the Construction Contractors Board, unless payment is subject to a good faith dispute as defined in ORS 279C.580.
- 9. Contractor shall not employ any person for more than 10 hours in any one day, or 40 hours in any one week, except in cases of necessity, emergency, or where the public policy absolutely requires it, and in such cases, the employee shall be paid at least time and a half pay when required under ORS 279C.520.
- 10. The Contractor shall promptly, as due, make payment to any person, copartnership, association or corporation, furnishing medical, surgical and hospital care or other needed care and attention, incident to sickness or injury, to the employees of such Contractor, all sums which the Contractor agrees to pay for such services and all monies and sums which the Contractor collected or deducted from wages of employees pursuant to any law, contract, or agreement for the purpose of providing or paying for such service.
- 11. The Contractor shall obtain and pay for all licenses and permits and shall pay all fees and charges for connections to outside services arising from the construction and completion of the Work.
- 12. The Oregon Government Standards and Practices laws may apply to the Contractor. ORS 244.040(1)(a) prohibits any government officer, employee or agent from using the governmental relationship to obtain a financial gain or avoid a financial detriment that would not otherwise be available but for the governmental relationship. There may be circumstances on a government project that the application of the laws may also apply to the Contractor. The Contractor should contact the Oregon Government Standards and Practices Commission for further information and applicability to this contract.
- 13. The Contractor and the Contractor's subcontractor shall not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, religion, color, sex or nation origin. The Contractor shall take affirmative action to assure that applicants are employed, and that employees are treated during employment without regard to their ace, religion, color, sex or national origin. Such action shall include, but not be limited to, the following: employment, upgrading, demotion or transfer; recruitment or recruitment advertising; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship. The Contractor agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices setting forth the policies of nondiscrimination.
- 14. The Contractor and its subcontractors shall, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by them or on their behalf, state that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to race, religion, color, sex or national origin.
