
DESCRIPTION OF CORNER EVIDENCE FOUND:

Found a 2 1/2" galvanized pipe with 2 1/2" brass cap marked as shown, 12" above ground in fence corner to Southeast, Northerly, and Westerly bearing fence lines on North side of cattle guard. Found monument bears North 36°58'28" West, a distance of 17.11 feet, from true corner position.



I use a tape and compass in the establishment of the new bearing trees. Bearings are measured from the center of the aluminum cap to a brass washer marked "OPLS 83571" tacked to the BT blaze using 14° East for declination. Distances are measured to from the center of the brass cap to a 60D spike in the center right base of the tree.
